

PERPETUAL PEACE: ROAD TO CONGRESS OF VIENNA (1791-1815) RULES OF PROCEDURE

Article 1: Scope of Implementation

Section 1.01 All the rules set out herein will apply from the official start of the committee henceforth. The committee does not follow a general assembly or crisis procedure and the special procedure set out herein will apply.

Section 1.02 The Rules of Procedure shall be explained by the Under-Secretary-General at the first session.

Article 2: Electronic Devices

Section 2.01 Since there were no electronic devices at the times the committee cover, the use of all electronic devices within the committee, even for research, is strictly prohibited.

Article 3: Roll-Call

Section 3.01 A roll call is taken at the beginning of each session and delegates simply vote "present".

Section 3.02 The roll call starts with the delegates of the French parliament, then moves to the Vienna Order and then to the 3rd Countries.

Article 4: Quorum

Section 4.01 The quorum for the meeting is met if a simple majority is present in each bloc at the beginning of every session.

Section 4.02 Delegates arriving late for the session shall submit a message paper to the Chair in order to be able to participate in the session and deliver a speech.

Section 4.03 Blocs to release a government program:

- (a) For the French Parliament, a simple majority must be achieved,
- (b) For the Vienna Order and the 3rd Countries, each country's proposal must achieve a simple majority.

Article 5: Rules Governing Discussions

Section 5.01 After the roll call, every delegate gives an opening speech.

Section 5.02 Semi-mod moderated caucus will automatically be followed.

(a) According to the semi-moderated caucus, instead of an individual delegates having particular speaking times, there is a total time for the entirety of delegates. After a delegate has spoken, another delegate may start speaking immediately.

(b) Unless a motion is given against the discussion will continue in semi-moderation.

Section 5.03 If necessary, delegates can propose a motion to have unmoderated caucus.

Article 6: Representation within the Committee

Section 6.01 Delegatory representation on the committee is primarily divided into three blocks. These being: French Parliament, Vienna Order, and 3rd countries.

Section 6.02 Representation in the French Parliament is also divided into three-time modules. The National Convention, Directory and the Consul period.

(a) During the Convention Period, delegates will represent members in proportion to the number of seats in the Convention held by the political parties of the period. At the same time, two predetermined delegates will represent the marshals of the period.

(b) During the Directory Period, the delegates shall represent the members of the Directory and the marshals.

(c) During the Consul Period, the delegates would represent the two members of Napoleon's entourage and the marshals.

(d) Changes in the French parliament will take place in the committee as they have have occurred historically. In other words, there will necessarily be transitions between the Convention, the Directory and the Consul periods.

- (e) During these changes, the placards will be arranged in such a way that they will rotate in accordance with the presented timeline.

Section 6.03 The countries of the Vienna Order bloc are represented by three delegates. These representatives being the Head of the Executive, Foreign Minister, and Commander of the Army.

Section 6.04 The countries of the 3rd Countries bloc will be represented by two delegates. These representatives being Government Representative and Commander of the Army.

Article 7: Committee Timeline

Section 7.01 Each session will cover two years.

Article 8: Committee Functioning

Section 8.01 The major events of these two years will be given as crisis according to the historical flow followed by the delegates.

Section 8.02 According to the given crises, directives will be written from time to time like the procedure in crisis committees.

Section 8.03 Blocs will have the right to publish a government program if they get enough votes among themselves.

Section 8.04 If other countries form coalitions, there will be a split into two cabinets and the wartime period will be governed by quick writing of directives.

- (a) During this period in the French Parliament:

- (i) *During the Convention Period, Charles-Pierre Augereau, Louis Desaix, the marshals of the time*
- (ii) *In the Directory Period, in addition to the marshals of the Convention Period, the marshals of the period, Henri Jacques Guillaume Clarke, André Masséna, Jean-Mathieu-Philibert Sérurier*
- (iii) *During the Consul Period, in addition to the marshals of the Directeur Period, the marshals of the period, Louis-Alexandre Berthier, Jean-Baptiste Jourdan, François Joseph Lefebvre, would take office.*

(b) In the Order of Vienna and the 3rd Countries blocs, the Commander of the Army will be in charge.

(c) While the military actions are in progress, other delegates will continue diplomatic discussions at the table. If necessary, they can consult or assist the commanders of their armies by sending message papers.

Article 9: Conclusion of Committee

Section 9.01 We will expect you to come up with a treaty document at the end of the committee according to the history shaped by the delegates.
